Caritas Staff are thrilled to be settling in to our new space at Northside Church of Christ. We have welcomed new clients who have discovered us for the first time. And new volunteers have joined our ranks to keep the food pantry organized and clean.

One major perk of our new system is that clients can now self select groceries right from the shelf. We believe in equiping and empowering people in the midst of life's set backs. Enabling folks to shop for their households helps them feel more in control and confident. It also prevents food waste and respects cultural/dietary restrictions. We are also able to open our Necessity Closet to clients during their weekly shop. Due to space constraints in our old facility, clients only received cleaning and hygiene products at pantry appointments and had to choose from a generic list for a volunteer to fulfill. Now, clients have direct



Currently Manny's volunteer service with Caritas spreads across a large range of duties where he can help wherever and whenever he is needed. He enjoys filling in when other volunteers cannot work their shift. He has worked the phones, served clients coming in for food, gone to Northwest Harvest, Second Harvest or area grocery stores to pick up food, repaired shelving, and cleaned, etc. There probably is very little at Caritas that he has not had a hand in over the years.

Manny has seen a lot of change with Caritas. He is excited for our new facility, stating that it has a lot more room—more than 2 times what we've had to work with in the past. We are able to organize it
