## **Growing Pains**

June 1, 2022, marked our one-year anniversary in our new facility! We have learned a lot while serving our clients in this new space and modified a few areas to be more efficient and equitable. We have also seen tremendous growth in need, but have struggled to keep our shelves fully stocked.

Compared to this same period last year, Caritas is currently serving 155% more individuals! Many families with children who were hovering just above

the poverty line have been plunged into an expanding bracket of need in response to rising housing costs and inflated grocery prices. Seniors on fixed budgets have been unable to keep up. Young adults are looking for second and third jobs to afford basic costs of living. However, food banks nationwide have been unable to match this unprecedented need. Last year, Caritas clients were receiving an average of 66 pounds of food per individual served, but this year that amount has dropped to 32 pounds.

During the pandemic, we prioritized access to food and essentials, allowing clients to visit as often as needed to provide for their families. Recently, we have had to modify this policy to our prepandemic guideline of only once per week for fresh produce, bread, proteins, and pantry staples. This is in direct response to supply and demand. In 2021, Caritas spent approximately \$6,000 on supplemental foods, beyond what was donated through our generous partners. In 2022, we have already accrued over \$10,000 in food expenses in just the first half of the year. With inflation projected to continue, we are actively seeking new opportunities to fill our shelves.

The first time she visited Caritas, she was amazed at the warm welcome she received from the volunteers, along with the wonderful food and necessities Caritas had available to clients.

Since her first visit to Caritas, she always feels respected by the friendly volunteer staff who greet her and help her with her shopping. Since then, she usually comes to Caritas weekly to replenish the basic food and necessities she needs.

When asked what she thinks of the new location Caritas moved into a year ago, she said, "I love it!" At the new location, Joanne appreciates selecting what she needs, "just like shopping in a regular grocery store," finding it eliminates wasting food she doesn't need or want. She especially loves all the fresh produce.

By shopping weekly at Caritas, Joanne feels she's able to save about \$100 a week...that's about \$400 a month! She loves the comradery at Caritas and feels they "have her back." Not only will the Caritas volunteers help her shop, but she knows they are more than willing to pray with her, if she needs, and are willing to give her a spiritual uplift.


In closing, Joanne says shopping at Caritas, "Energizes her hope for humanity."
